

## **OPPORTUNITY – FIELD ASSISTANT**

### **Redmoor Tin – Tungsten Project, Cornwall**

Cornwall Resources Limited is a joint venture between AIM listed Strategic Minerals and ASX listed New Age Exploration Ltd., exploring the exciting Redmoor tin-tungsten deposit. The project is located near Kelly Bray, close to Callington, Cornwall.

A significant exploration drilling program aimed at increasing the high-grade potential underground resource is planned to start in March 2017.

#### **The Opportunity**

Cornwall Resources is inviting applications for the post of Field Assistant. The Field Assistant will be responsible for supporting all geological staff in the day-to-day implementation of drilling activities in conjunction with the Senior Geologist, to whom they will report. They will ensure that the policies and procedures of Cornwall Resources are followed, and that work is completed safely and professionally, to a good standard, and on a timely and cost effective basis. They will seek at all times to maintain positive relationships with the local community.

This role will be based working at the field site, starting during March 2017, for a duration of approximately 6 months. The successful candidate needs either to be based within daily driving distance, or to be willing to relocate to the locality at their own expense.

This role is not a geological role but could provide a useful opportunity for someone interested in starting a geology/mining career. This is a non-technical position, and will involve manual handling, housekeeping and logistical support work. Much of the working day may be spent outside.
